STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Concerning Criminal Trespass.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

17-A MRSA § 402, sub-§ 1, as enacted by PL 1975, c. 499, § 1, is amended to read:

1. A person is guilty of criminal trespass if, knowing that he is not licensed or privileged to do so:

A. He enters in any secured premises; or

B. He remains in any place in defiance of a lawful order to leave which was personally communicated to him by the owner or other authorized person;

C. He enters in and upon the land of another if that land is posted in a manner prescribed by law or in a manner likely to come to the attention of intruders; or

D. He allows any creature, which he owns or possesses, to enter in and upon the land of another. Failure to heed a first warning from such land owner, authorized occupant, any law enforcement officer or any public official will be prima facie evidence of his knowingness.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to bring the act of unauthorized entry upon **conspicuously posted property and the continuing entry** of domestic animals upon property, not that of their owners, back to a former criminal status.
