STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Increase the Permissible State Discount for the Sale of Liquor to Special Agency Stores to 15%.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

28 MRSA § 204, as last amended by PL 1975, c. 771, § 302, is further amended by adding after the 2nd sentence the following:

However, the commission shall sell spirituous and vinous liquor, except for table wine, to special agency stores, established under section 153, for a price of 15% less than the retail price established for the state retail store where the purchase is made, provided that this discount shall not apply to federal taxes levied on or after November 1, 1941.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill permits state liquor stores to sell liquor to special agency stores at a 15% discount and will thus enable agency store operators to meet overhead costs.
