STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SEVENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Concerning Fees of the Board of Chiropractic Examiners.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 32 MRSA § 551, 2nd sentence, is amended to read:

Said application shall be filed with the secretary of the board at least 7 days before the date of examination, together with a deposit of ~~\$25~~ \$100, which said deposit shall be returned to applicant in case the application is rejected.

Sec. 2. 32 MRSA § 552, 2nd ¶, 1st sentence, is amended to read:

Any person of good moral character, licensed by a chiropractic board of any other state or territory having a standard equal to the State of Maine, shall be licensed without examination, upon the payment of ~~\$25~~ \$100 and the production to the board of his or her diploma, the license obtained in such other state and satisfactory evidence of good moral character.

Sec. 3. 32 MRSA § 553, 5th sentence, as last amended by PL 1973, c. 65, § 2, is further amended to read:

The compensation of members of the board shall be ~~\$10~~ \$25 per day for each day actually spent in the discharge of their duties within the State and ~~\$25~~ \$50 per day for each day actually spent in the discharge of their duties out of State, and necessary traveling expenses.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill amends the Board of Chiropractic Examiners' statute by:

1. Changing the examination fee from \$25 to \$100;
2. Changing the per diem within the State from \$10 to \$25; and
3. Changing the per diem out of state from \$25 to \$50.
