SENATE AMENDMENT "A " to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P.
246, L.D. 755, Bill, "AN ACT Prohibiting State Legislators
from Serving as Lobbyists within 4 Years of their Retirement
from Office."

Amend the Amendment by inserting at the end before the
statement of fact the following new paragraph:

'This section shall not prohibit a person from lobbying on
behalf of an employer which represents or is an association
of employers or workers in the same
industry, business or profession as the industry,
business or profession in which the person was employed/while
serving as a member of the House of Representatives or Senate
of this State. The Secretary of State shall, upon request of
a person subject to this section, designate that type of
employer for which a person subject to this section may accept
employment as a lobbyist.'

Statement of Fact

This amendment permits Legislators to lobby on behalf of
industry, business or professional groups representing the industry,
business or profession to which the Legislator belonged/while
he was serving in the Legislature.
