# STATE OF MAINE

# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-SEVEN

### AN ACT Relating to Solid Waste Disposal.

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts passed by the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the Legislature has established a deadline for certain types of solid waste disposal; and

Whereas, present economic conditions threaten great hardships to those towns which must find other means for disposal; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vitally necessary to revise the restriction on solid waste disposal; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, no state agency may impose any rule, regulation, law or ordinance on solid waste disposal which is more stringent than federal law, federal environmental rules, federal regulations or federal ordinances.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

# STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill would make certain that Maine's standards on solid waste disposal do not exceed those of the Federal Government.

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
