STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Concerning Possession of Spruce Grouse.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

12 MRSA § 1960-A, as last amended by PL 1973, c. 739, § 2, is further amended by inserting before the last paragraph a new paragraph to read:

Any person authorized under chapters 301 to 335, or under regulations promulgated by the commissioner, to possess 2 or more ruffed grouse may possess one spruce grouse in place of one of those ruffed grouse.

STATEMENT OF FACT

At present, a regulation of the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife prohibits possession of any spruce grouse, although it permits possession of up to 4 ruffed grouse. However, it is impossible when hunting grouse to distinguish at a distance between ruffed grouse and spruce grouse. This bill provides that a person who has killed what he thought was a ruffed grouse only to find it is a spruce grouse will not be penalized for his mistake, as he will be permitted to have one spruce grouse in his possession.
