STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Require Trappers to Check Their Traps Every 24 Hours in Unorganized Places.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

12 MRSA § 2351, 1st sentence, as last amended by PL 1971, c. 403, § 14, is further amended to read:

Any person trapping in any organized or, incorporated or unorganized place shall visit each trap or cause the same to be visited at least once in every calendar day, including Sunday, except beaver sets, so called.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to require trappers in unorganized places within the State to visit their traps at least once every day, including Sunday.
