COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 769, L.D. 960, Bill,  
"AN ACT Relating to State Liquor Identification Cards."

Amend the Bill by striking out everything after the amending clause and inserting in its place the following:  
'The application form shall include, directly above the signature line, the following notice to the applicant: "I understand that knowingly supplying false information to a state agency is a Class D offense punishable by confinement of one to 3 years or by a monetary fine of up to \$5,000, or by both."

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to provide a warning to be included in all applications for state liquor identification cards. The warning would remind the applicant that furnishing false information in procuring the identification card could result in his imprisonment or the imposition of a fine.
