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**AN ACT Relating to State Liquor Identification Cards.**

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

28 MRSA § 1060, 1st ¶, as last amended by PL 1971, c. 622, § 89-B, is further amended by adding after the first sentence the following new sentence:

The application form shall include, directly above the signature line, the following notice to the applicant: "I understand that knowingly supplying false information to a state agency is a Class D offense punishable by confinement or by a monetary fine, or by both."

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide a warning to be included in all applications for state liquor identification cards. The warning would remind the applicant that furnishing false information in procuring the identification card could result in his imprisonment or the imposition of a fine.
