STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Concerning the Size of Squares on Election Ballots.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 21 MRSA § 701, sub-§ 2, ¶ F, as amended by PL 1973, c. 160, § 2, is further amended to read:

F. Squares printed. A square, measuring $\frac{1}{4}$ " on each side, must be printed at the left and close to the name of each candidate or write-in space, so that a voter may designate his choice clearly by a cross (X) or a check mark($\sqrt{}$).

Sec. 2. 21 MRSA § 702, sub-§ 2, ¶ H, as amended by PL 1973, c. 160, § 6, is further amended to read:

H. Squares printed. A square, measuring $\frac{1}{4}$ " on each side, must be printed at the left and close to the name of each nominee or write-in space, so that a voter may designate his choice clearly by a cross or a check mark in it.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to require that the square on an election or primary ballot in which a voter makes his cross or check measures $\frac{1}{4}$ " on each side. The squares presently provided are too small to permit adequate marking and avoid mistakes.
