STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, to Grant Creditable Service under the Maine State Retirement System to A. Edward Langlois, Jr., of South Portland.

A. Edward Langlois, Jr., retirement credit. Resolved: That the Maine State Retirement System shall grant A. Edward Langlois, Jr., of South Portland creditable service under the State Retirement System for the period March 2, 1946 through July 5, 1950; and be it further

Resolved: That there is appropriated from the General Fund to the Maine State Retirement System the sum of \$16,746 for the fiscal year 1977-78 to be used to carry out the purposes of this Act.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill grants A. Edward Langlois, Jr., of South Portland creditable service under the State Retirement System for the period March 2, 1946 through July 5, 1950. During this period, Mr. Langlois served as alumni secretary for the Maine Maritime Academy, with duties including public relations, publicity and director of placement. On July 5, 1950, he assumed additional duties at the Maine Maritime Academy. When the academy joined the State Retirement System in 1952, it granted credit for previous service with the academy. In Mr. Langlois' case, the credit was granted back to July 5, 1950, instead of back to March 2, 1946.

This bill will grant creditable service to Mr. Langlois back to the time when he first began working for the Maine Maritime Academy.
