COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A " to H.P. 992, L.D. 1191, Bill,  
"AN ACT to Define Duties and Set Salaries for Special and Part-time  
Deputy Sheriffs."

Amend the Bill in section 1 by inserting at the end of  
subsection 3 of that part designated "§853." the following:  
'"County law enforcement duties" under this subsection does  
not include acting as a court officer, and any compensation  
for acting as a court officer shall not be included in the  
\$2,500 limit of this subsection.'

Further amend the Bill in section 4 by striking out all  
of the first paragraph of subsection 1 of that part designated  
"§958." and inserting in its place the following:  
'1. Full-time deputies.  
✓ Full-time deputies shall be compensated at a rate not less  
than \$21 per day based on a 7-day work week, or at a rate  
not less than \$23 per day based on a 7-day work week, if the  
deputy has:'

Further amend the Bill in section 4 by inserting at the  
end of subsection 2 of that part designated "§958." the  
following:  
'Compensation paid to a part-time deputy for serving as a court  
officer shall not be included in the \$2,500 limitation on  
compensation.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to remove any compensation received by a part-time deputy for service as a court officer from the \$2,500 limitation on compensation. This amendment also retains the present minimum compensation for deputies, but clarifies that the minimum per diem is based on a 7-day work week.
