HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1009, L.D. 1212, RESOLUTION,
Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution Allowing the
Legislature to Impose a Different Rate of Taxation Upon
Properties Outside of Incorporated Municipalities and
Plantations.

Amend the Resolution by striking out all of the title and inserting in its place the following: 'RESOLUTION,

Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution Permitting the Additional Power of Levying

Legislature the/a Tax Exclusively Upon Real and Personal Property in the Unorganized Territory."

Further amend the Resolution in that part relating to the Constitution, Art. IX, §8, 1st sentence by inserting at the end after the punctuation the following underlined sentence: 'The Legislature shall also have the power to levy a tax/ upon real and personal property in the unorganized territory.'

Further amend the Resolution by striking out all of the question and inserting in its place the following:

'"Shall the Constitution be amended as proposed by a resolution of the Legislature permitting the Legislature the additional power of levying a tax exclusively upon real and personal property in the unorganized territory?" '

## Statement of Fact

This amendment simplifies the proposed constitutional amendment by permitting the Legislature, in addition to its other taxing powers, to levy taxes only upon real and personal property in the unorganized territory. Limitations on the amount of this type of tax and concerning the uses for this type of tax are better left to the Legislature to impose by statute rather than inserted in the Constitution, as circumstances in the unorganized territory can change radically from decade to decade.
