HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P.

1071, L.D. 1263, Bill, "AN ACT to Allow Free Hunting and Fishing

Licenses to Maine Residents over 65 and to Disabled War Veterans."

Amend the amendment by striking out all of the 3rd paragraph and inserting in its place the following:

'15-A. Complimentary licenses to disabled war veterans. A complimentary license to hunt or fish, or a combination hunting and fishing license, shall be issued to any resident of Maine who is a veteran, as defined in Title 37-A, section 28, has a service connected disability of no more than 60%, as a result of honorable military service, who has served in a combat zone during either World War I, World War II, Korean War or the Viet wam War and who applies for that license to the commissioner.

This application shall be accompanied by a xerox or photo copy of the applicants final DD form 214 or other evidence satisfactory to the commissioner that the applicant meets the requirements of this subsection. Each license issued under this subsection shall remain valid for 3 calendar years from the date of its issue.'
