COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1038, L.D. 1268, Bill, "AN ACT Concerning the Criminal Penalty for the Crime of Deceptive Business Practices."

Amend the Bill by striking everything after the enacting clause and inserting in its place the following:

17-A MRSA §901, sub-§4, as enacted by PL 1975, c. 499, §1, is amended to read:

4. Deceptive business practices is a Class E D crime.

Statement of Fact

The amendment keeps in the part of the bill that would raise the classification of the crime. It strikes the provisions raising the classification still further for second and subsequent violations. There is sufficient flexibility in the statutes for the courts to determine appropriate penalties in such cases.
