STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SEVENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Eligibility Conditions under the Workmen's
Compensation Laws.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

26 MRSA § 1192, sub-§ 2, as repealed and replaced by PL 1975, c. 25, is amended by adding after the first sentence a new sentence to read:

The commission by regulation shall insure that an unemployed individual seeking benefits shall not be given more than 2 work registration forms at any one time.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill will require that any unemployed individual who is eligible to receive benefits shall report to an employment office to register for work at least once every 2 weeks. The current practice is to give the unemployed individual 5 work registration forms allowing the unemployed individual to presign them and mail them in, in fulfillment of the requirements of Title 26, section 1192.
