STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Amend the Criminal Code Concerning Sexual Abuse of Minors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

17-A MRSA § 254, sub-§ 1, as amended by PL 1975, c. 740, § 50, is further amended to read:

I. A person is guilty of sexual abuse of a minor if, having attained his 18th birthday he engages in sexual intercourse or a sexual act with another person not his spouse, who has attained his 14th birthday but has not attained his 16th birthday; provided the actor is at least 5 years older than such other.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The sexual abuse of minors section of the Maine Criminal Code presently requires that a person be 19 years of age before he can be charged with this offense. It also precludes a charge being brought if there is not at least 5 years difference in age between the actor and the minor. This bill would allow an 18 year old to be charged with this crime and deletes the 5 year difference in age requirement.
