# STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-SEVEN

#### AN ACT to Increase the Minimum Wage to \$3 per Hour.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

26 MRSA § 664, 1st ¶, as amended by PL 1975, c. 352, is further amended to read:

By reason of the declaration of policy set forth in section 661 and in the protection of the industry or business and in the enhancement of public interest, health, safety and welfare, it is declared unlawful for any employer to employ any employee, except as otherwise provided in this subchapter, at the rate of less than 2.30 are nour; or to require any employee to work more than 40 hours in one week, unless  $1\frac{1}{2}$  times the regular hourly rate is paid for all work done over 40 hours in any one week; and whenever the highest federal minimum wage is increased in excess of 2.30 g per hour, the minimum wage established under this section shall be increased to the same amount, effective on the same date as the increase in the highest federal minimum wage but in no case shall the minimum wage exceed 33 per hour.

### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill increases the minimum wage to \$3 per hour and removes the present ceiling on minimum wage increases resulting from increases in the highest federal minimum wage.
