IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Appropriating Funds from the General Fund for the Purpose of Developing a Parking Lot in Lincolnville.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, it is vitally necessary for construction to begin at once to avoid needless congestion of traffic during the height of the tourist season; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Department of Transportation authorized to acquire property for parking lot in Lincolnville. The Department of Transportation is authorized to acquire property for the specific purpose of building a parking lot in Lincolnville for the use of patrons of the Maine State Ferry Service between Lincolnville and Islesboro. The process of eminent domain may be used for this purpose in the same manner as provided in the Revised Statutes, Title 23, section 154.

Sec. 2. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Transportation, the sum of \$45,000 for the purpose of acquiring property and building a parking lot in Lincolnville for the use of patrons of the Maine State Ferry Service between Lincolnville and Islesboro.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide the necessary funds to acquire land and to build a parking lot for the use of the patrons of the Maine State Ferry Service in Lincolnville.
