HOUSE AMENDMENT "C" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1201,
L.D. 1430, Bill, "AN ACT Reinstituting Public Intoxication as a
Crime."

Amend the amendment by striking out all of the first paragraph and inserting in its place the following:

'Amend the bill by striking out all of the title and inserting in its place the following: "AN ACT Relating to Public Intoxication."

Further amend the amendment in the 5th line from the end before the statement of fact
/ by inserting after the underlined words "whichever time is less" and before the period
/ the underlined punctuation and words ', but in no event may any
person who is unconscious be civilly detained in any facility
under this section until that person has been examined by a
licensed allopathic or osteopathic physician'

Statement of Fact

This amendment provides that an unconscious person may not be civilly detained in any facility under the bill until that person has been examined by a licensed allopathic or osteopathic physician.
