COMMITTEE AMENDMENT" A" H.P. 1157, L.D. 1456, RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution to Provide that the Secretary of State be Elected by Popular Vote and to Establish the Duties of That Office.

Amend the resolution by striking out all of the 7th paragraph and inserting in its place the following:

'Section 3. Election; votes to be returned to Secretary of State; provisions in case of time. Beginning with the election of 1978, the meetings for election of Governor and Secretary of State shall be notified, held and regulated and votes shall be received, sorted, counted and declared and recorded, in the same manner as those for Senators and Representatives.'

## Resolution

Further amend the / by striking out all of the 20th paragraph and inserting in its place the following:

'Constitution, Art. V. Pt. 3rd, §§1-A, 1-B, 1-C and 1-D are enacted to read:'

Resolution / by striking out all of the 8th para-Further amend the graph from the end before the Statement of Fact.

## Statement of Fact

This amendment removes the provision for the Governor and Secretary of State to run together in the general election, and provides for individual election contests. It also removes the authority of the Secretary of State to act in the stead of the Governor when the Governor is absent.
