AN ACT to Limit Access to Security Interest Records Filed in a
Municipality.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

11 MRSA § 9-409 is enacted to read:

§ 9-409. Release of information; authorization

Notwithstanding the provisions of section 9-407 or any other provision of law, the clerk of any municipality shall not permit access to, furnish copies of, or give any information concerning any financing statement, continuation statement, termination statement, statement of assignment, statement of release or other record, document or information kept or maintained pursuant to this Title unless:

1. Person originally filing security interest. The person seeking the information, copies or access to the records is the person who originally filed the security interest to which the records pertain; or

2. Authorization. The person seeking access to those records presents to the clerk a statement, signed by the debtor named in the records, authorizing the clerk to release, copy or allow access to those records.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill would limit access to records concerning security interests filed in a municipality. A signed authorization from the debtor would be necessary to permit access to these records by any person except the person who originally filed the security interest.
