SENATE AMENDMENT "B" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1310, L.D. 1634, Bill, "AN ACT to Prohibit the Practice of Mandatory Retirement Age."

Amend the amendment in section 20 by striking out all of the first paragraph and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 20. Effective dates; compliance. Sections 1 to 13, 15, 16, 18 and 19 of this Act shall become effective July 1, 1978.'

Further amend the amendment in section 20, 2nd paragraph, by striking out all of the first sentence and inserting in its place the following:

'Sections 14 and 17 of this Act shall become effective January 1, 1980.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to provide that provisions pertaining to teachers and county and municipal employees, as well as to Maine State Retirement employees, would not go into effect until July 1, 1978. The Human Rights Act and the provisions relating to the private sector would be effective January 1, 1980 in order to give the private sector an opportunity to implement the changes.
