COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "f" to H.P. 1384, L.D. 1664, Resolve,
to Provide for the Development of Recommendations on Coastal
Policy Issues.

Amend the ^{resolve} / by striking out all of the 13th paragraph
and inserting in its place the following:

'1. What areas of the coast present the highest
opportunities for development of port facilities for cargo
handling, recreation, fish processing and oil handling while
presenting the least potential for environmental degradation?
How can the state public institutions best capitalize on these
opportunities? It shall be the responsibility of the Department
of Transportation working with the Department of Environmental
Protection and the Bureau of Parks and Recreation to formulate
the report on this issue.'

Further amend the ^{resolve} / in the 15th paragraph (same in L.D.)
by striking out in the 7th line (6th in L.D.) the words
"Environmental Protection" and inserting in / ^{their} place the
following:

'Conservation'

Further amend the ^{resolve} / in the 17th paragraph (same in L.D.)
by striking out in the 4th line (3rd in L.D.) the word
"Conservation" and inserting in its place the following:

'Environmental Protection'

Further amend the / by inserting before the 3rd
from the end,
paragraph/before the Statement of Fact the following:

'7. What areas of the coast contain unique or valuable scenic, recreational or natural resources which would be incompatible with significant development? How can these areas be protected without undue constraint on the overall economic development potential of the coastal region? It shall be the responsibility of the State Planning Office working with the Department of Environmental Protection and the Department of Conservation to formulate the report on this issue.'

Statement of Fact

This amendment changes some of the departmental responsibilities to put greater emphasis on the environmental and scenic attributes of the coast and changes in sections 1, 3 and 5 which departments will carry out the studies.
