COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 479, L.D. 1742, Bill,
"AN ACT Providing for Changes in the Laws Relating to Property
Taxation."

Amend the Bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and inserting in its place the following:

'Appropriation. There is appropriated, for the purpose of funding the expenses created by Title 36, section 844, from the General Fund the sum of \$25,000 to the State Board of Assessment Review. The breakdown shall be as follows:

## Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to remove all sections of the original bill except for section 15 which is an appropriation for needed funding of the State Board of Assessment Review. This board currently handles appeals of property tax bills by persons living in primary assessing areas. It is composed of persons qualified to judge the technical issues in such appeals. Another bill reported out this session by the Committee of Taxation allows persons who do not live in primary assessing areas to, at their option, appeal their property tax bills to this board.
