HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 481, L.D. 1743, Bill, "AN ACT to Establish 4-year Motor Vehicle Licenses."

Amend the Bill in the Title by inserting at the end, before the period, the following: 'for Persons under 65 Years of Age'

Further

/amend the Bill by striking out all of section 2 and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 2. 29 MRSA §542, first paragraph is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

For persons who have not reached their 65th birthday, all new and renewal licenses to operate motor vehicles shall expire at midnight on the license holder's 4th birthday next following the date of issuance of license. The fee for such license shall be \$10.

For persons who have reached their 65th birthday, all new and renewal licenses to operate motor vehicles shall expire at midnight on the license holder's 2nd birthday next following the date of issuance of license. The fee for such license shall be \$5.'

Further amend the Bill by striking out all of the last underlined paragraph of section 3 and inserting in its place the following:

'The transition to the 4-year license for persons not yet 65 years old shall be made in the following manner: The Secretary of State shall devise a schedule whereby 1/2 of all of those renewal licenses shall be issued for 4 years. Upon the expiration of those 2-year renewal licenses, all licenses thereafter for persons not yet 65 years of age shall be issued for 4 years. The fee for all

2-year licenses shall be \$5.

Statement of Fact

This amendment provides for 4-year drivers' licenses for persons under 65 years of age and 2-year drivers' licenses for persons 65 years of age or older.
