HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1639, L.D. 1838, Bill, "AN ACT to Revise the Laws Relating to Barbers and Cosmetologists."

Amend the bill in section 10 in that part designated "§1551." subsection 4, by striking out all of paragraph D.

Further amend the bill in section 10, by striking out all of that part designated "§1554." and inserting in its place the following:

'§1554. Electrolysis

Electrolysis is the application of electrical equipment to remove hair from the body, other than by electrified tweezing methods, and is not part of the practice of cosmetology. Electrolysis is further classed as an allied health profession and is not regulated by this chapter.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to help keep fraudulent equipment and operations out of the State of Maine and to permit trained electrologists to use electrolysis to remove body hair without the direction of a licensed physician.
