HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1692, L.D. 1872, Bill, "AN ACT to Revise Primary and Nomination Petitions."

Amend the Bill in section 1 in that part designated "<u>§445.</u>" by striking out in paragraph A of subsection 5 the following underlined words and punctuation: ", at least 1,000 of whom must be from each congressional district"

Further amend the Bill in section 1 in that part designated "§445." by striking out in paragraph B of subsection 5 the following underlined words and punctuation: ", at least 1,000 of whom must be from each congressional district"

Further amend the Bill in section 2 in that part designated "§494." by striking out in paragraph A of subsection 5 the following underlined words and punctuation: ", at least 1,000 of whom must be from each congressional district"

Further amend the Bill in section 2 in that part designated "<u>§494.</u>" by striking out in paragraph B of subsection 5 the following underlined words and punctuation: ", at least 1,000 of whom must be from each congressional district"

Further amend the Bill in section 2 in that part designated "§494." by striking out in paragraph C of subsection 5 the following underlined words and punctuation: ", at least 1,000 of whom must be from each congressional district"
