SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1680, L.D. 1874, Bill, "AN ACT to Revise the Maine Tort Claims Act."

Amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated "§8103." in subsection 1 in the 2nd and 3rd lines (same in L.D.) by striking out the underlined words "and employees of the State acting within the course or scope of their employment"

Statement of Fact

This amendment would retain the availability of a cause of action against a state employee for injuries caused in the course or scope of employment by the tortious conduct of the employee. The employee would retain immunity from suit where his actions were judicial, quasi-judicial, legislative, quasi-legislative or discretionary in nature.
