HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1741, L.D. 1889, Bill,
"AN ACT to Reform the Regulation of Watch, Guard and Patrol
Agencies and of Private Detectives."

Amend the Bill in section 1 by striking out all of that part designated "§3782." and inserting in its place the following:

'§3782. Part-time and off-duty law enforcement officers

Any person currently employed as a state, county or local law enforcement officer or any constable, either full time or part time, who is bonded in accordance with this chapter and who engages in the activity regulated by this chapter on a part-time or off-duty basis, shall not be required to obtain a license as required by section 3765.'

Statement of Fact

This amendment allows law enforcement officers or constables to act as security guards, without obtaining a license, for profit—making organizations. The current bill restricts their activity to nonprofit organizations.
