HOUSE AMENDMENT "D" to H.P. 1741, L.D. 1889, Bill, "AN ACT to Reform the Regulation of Watch, Guard and Patrol Agencies and of Private Detectives."

Amend the Bill in section 1 by striking out all of that part designated "§3777."

Further amend the Bill in section 1 by striking out all of that part designated "§3782." and inserting in its place the following:

'§3782. Part-time and off-duty law enforcement officers

Any person who engages in the activity regulated by this chapter on a part-time basis, whose primary source of income is not derived from such and who does not hire help nor advertise as being engaged in the business of watch, guard or patrol agency work shall not be required to obtain a license or bond as required by section 3765.'

Further amend the Bill in section 1 by renumbering those parts designated "§3778." to "§3783." to be '§3777.' to '§3782.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this Amendment is to allow any person to per-

form the functions of a part-time security guard and to repeal unworkable provisions relating to the exposure of handguns during inclement weather.
