HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1886, L.D. 1943, RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution to Grant to the Supreme Judicial Court the Power to Remove a Judicial Officer from Office.

Amend the Resolution in the 3rd paragraph, (same in L.D.)

by striking out the word "seven" and inserting in its place
the following:

'seven four'

Further amend the Resolution in the 3rd paragraph, (same in L.D.) by inserting at the end the following new sentence:

'All judicial officers appointed before January 1, 1979,

to seven-year terms may continue to serve those terms until their expiration.'

Statement of Fact

This amendment provides that judicial officers shall serve terms of four years, instead of seven years, but permits judicial officers appointed prior to January 1, 1979, to continue serving until the expiration of their seven-year terms.

This amendment would provide increased judicial accountability to the citizens of Maine by ensuring that the performance of judicial officers can be scrutinized both by the Governor and by the Legislature at least every four years.
