COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A " to S.P. 628, L.D. 1960, Bill, "AN ACT to Amend the Appeal Procedures in the Employment Security Law."

Amend the Bill by inserting before the enacting clause the following:

'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, since the 1973-74 economic recession the number i unemployment benefit appeals to the commission has more than tripled; and

Whereas, the need for this emergency legislation is to relieve the Chairman of the 3-member commission from the responsibility of scheduling appeals and conducting hearings all across the State; and

Whereas, the Chairman has additional responsibilities for administration of the department, which is impeded by the time required for conducting hearings; and

Whereas, this legislation would expedite the hearing of unemployment benefit appeals thereby eliminating delay in

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processing decisions and benefit payments to unemployed individuals; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Further amend the Bill by inserting at the end before the Statement of Fact the following:

<u>'Emergency clause.</u> In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to make it an emergency measure.
