STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SEVENTY-EIGHT

AN ACT to Exempt an Electrician, who Fails to Renew his License, from Reexamination for a Period of 5 Years.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

32 MRSA § 1204, as last amended by PL 1975, c. 767, § 39, is further amended by adding at the end the following new paragraph to read:

Any license issued under this subchapter may be renewed during a 5-year period following the date of expiration without an examination provided, in addition to the license fee required under this subchapter, payment of a \$5 fee is made for each year which has lapsed.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to permit a duly licensed electrician to be reinstated without an examination, provided the reinstatement is requested within a 5-year period following examination of a valid state license and provided, in addition to the regular license fee, a \$5 fee is paid for each year which has lapsed.
