AN ACT Relating to Eligibility of Adult Education Instructors under the Unemployment Compensation Laws.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

26 MRSA § 1043, sub-§ 11, ¶ F, sub-¶ (33) is enacted to read:

(33) Services performed by an adult education teacher if he is paid on a per diem basis and is employed less than 45 days in a base period.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide that supplemental wages earned by teachers who work part time as adult education instructors will not be covered under the unemployment compensation laws.
