RESOLVE, Authorizing a Partial Disability Pension under the Maine State Retirement System to William T. Bachelder of Baldwin.

William T. Bachelder; partial disability pension authorized.

RESOLVED: That William T. Bachelder of Baldwin be granted from the Maine State Retirement System a disability pension equal to 50% of 2/3 of his final compensation on condition that he pay into the Maine State Retirement System moneys totalling \$3,329, which were previously refunded to him from the Maine State Retirement System at the time of his departure from state service; and be it further

Appropriation; Resolved: That the following funds shall be appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve:

STATEMENT OF FACT

This resolve would grant William T. Bachelder, a former employee of the Department of Transportation and of the Men's Correctional Center disability benefits based on his

permanent disability. This disability was caused in large part by a medical condition resulting from his employment with the State. At the time he left state service, it was not apparent that he would be permanently disabled, and he did not realize that he might be eligible for disability benefits.

The amount of the benefits for which Mr. Bachelder would ultimately be eligible would be about \$2,252 a year or \$187 a month.
