# STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-EIGHT

### AN ACT to Revise the Method of Computing Legislators' Expenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

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Sec. 1. 3 MRSA § 2, 3rd  $\P$ , as last repealed and replaced by PL 1975, c. 750, § 1, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

Each member of the Senate and House of Representatives shall receive the following expense allowance for each day in attendance at sessions of the Legislature: \$35, if his residence is beyond 50-mile radius of the Capitol; \$30, if his residence is within 30 to 50-mile radius of the Capitol; \$25, if his residence is within 15 to 30-mile radius of the Capitol; and \$15, if his residence is 15 miles or less from the Capitol. Each member shall also recieve an annual allowance for constituent services in the amount of \$200.

Sec. 2. Appropriation. The following funds shall be appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act:

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## STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide a new method of calculating legislators' expenses. The proposed method provides a flat amount of expenses for those residing within a certain radius of the State Capitol in place of computation of individual mileage.

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
