Henry E. Ripley; reimbursed.

RESOLVED: That the decision of the State Claims Board be appealed to the Legislature, pursuant to the Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1510, subsection 1; and be it further

Resolved: That there is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of \$850 to reimburse Henry E. Ripley of Augusta as a full and final settlement of his claim against the State for loss of his tools and equipment from the garage at the Augusta Mental Health Institute on or about Friday, June 25, 1976.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Henry E. Ripley of Augusta was employed as a mechanic at the Augusta Mental

Health Institute. Because of a shortage of funds at the institute, Mr. Ripley was asked to use his own tools on the job until the institute could afford to furnish him with the necessary equipment. On June 25, 1976, the maintenance garage at the institute was broken into, and tools and equipment were stolen, including all of Mr. Ripley's tools and equipment. His tools were valued at \$1,350.

Mr. Ripley submitted a claim for his lost tools and equipment to the State Claims Board, which awarded him \$500. This resolve is an appeal, under the appropriate statute for the remainder of the \$1,350 which he lost because of the theft at the Augusta Mental Health Institute.
