Amend the bill in section 6,/subsection 2, paragraph A,

subparagraph (5) by striking cut all of divisions (a) through

(j) and inserting in their place the following:

(a) Assistant to the Commissioner

(b) Deputy Commissioner.

Further amend the bill by striking out all of section 16 and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 16. 20 MRSA §1-B, sub-§5, as enacted by PL 1971, c. 610, §3, is amended by inserting at the end the following new sentence:

'All these persons shall be subject to the Personnel Law, except for the Deputy Commissioner of Educational and Cultural Services and the **Assistant to the **Commissioner.'

Statement of Fact

This amendment provides that all personnel in the Department of Educational and Cultural Services previously subject to this bill shall be under the Personnel Law, except for the position of deputy commissioner which is designated a major policy-making position.
