SEVENTY-EIGHT

AN ACT Relating to Appropriating Funds for Certain Municipal Governments.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriations for necessary expenditures of certain municipal governments. In order to provide assistance for some of the necessary expenditures of certain municipal governments, there is appropriated from the General Fund the amount of \$1,029,361 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1979. The Treasurer of State is ordered and directed to pay the amounts listed below on or before December 31, 1978. These sums shall be distributed by the municipal treasurer, when authorized by the legislative body for the necessary expenses of local government. The breakdown shall be as follows:
