
Further amend the amendment on page 8, by striking out in the 3rd line from the end, the figure "\$6,414,400" and inserting in its place the following: '\$6,364,400'

The purpose of this amendment is to include \$1,500,000 for an Environmental Services Building at the University of Maine, Orono, in the bond issue for capital improvements. It also reduces from \$2,550,000 to \$1,000,000 the amount to be provided for capital improvements to the Supreme Judicial Court building.
