IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-EIGHT

AN ACT to Establish a Two-inch Minimum Size for Soft-shell Clams.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 12 MRSA § 3901, 1st ¶, is amended to read:

It is unlawful for any person to take or have in his possession soft-shell clams or quahogs which are less than 2 inches in the longest diameter to the amount of more than 10% of any lot.

Sec. 2. 12 MRSA § 3901, sub-§ § 1 and 3, are amended to read:

- 1. Definitions. A lot, as used in this section, means the total number of soft-shell clams or quahogs in any bulk pile. Where soft-shell clams or quahogs are in a box, barrel or other container, the contents of each box, barrel or other container constitute a separate lot.
- 3. Exception of permittee. This section does not apply to the possession of seed soft-shell clams or quahogs under authority of a permit, issued by the commissioner, as provided in section 4308.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill creates a size limit on soft-shell clams, by requiring a minimum 2 inch size.
