HOUSE AMENDMENT "G" to S.P. 772, L.D. 2209, RESOLUTION,  
Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution to Limit the Amount  
of Government Spending and Taxes which may be Made without  
Voter Approval.

Amend the Resolution by striking out all of the first  
underlined sentence of the 4th paragraph and inserting in its  
place the following underlined sentence:

'Revenues accruing to a unit, in excess of the limitation  
determined in subsection 1, shall be refunded or credited to the  
people or used to prepay long-term indebtedness or used  
to reduce property taxes.'

Further amend the resolution in the 4th paragraph by  
striking out all of the 2nd sentence which reads: "Tax  
rates shall be adjusted to minimize such excesses."

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to insure that revenues  
accruing in excess of limitations may be used for property  
tax relief.
