HOUSE AMENDMENT "E" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "C" to H.P. 2345, L.D. 2212, RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution to Limit the Amount of Revenues which may be Raised by Taxes in any Fiscal Year.

Amend the Amendment by striking out all of the first paragraph after the title and inserting in its place the following:

'Amend the Resolution by striking out all of the title and inserting in its place the following: 'RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution to Limit the Amount of State Expenditures which may be Made from Undedicated Revenues without 'oter Approval and to Provide for Local Control of Local Expenditure Limitation.'

Further amend the Amendment by striking out all of the 9th line after the title and inserting in its place the following:

'Constitution, Art. I, §22, sub-§§l to 4 are enacted to'

Further amend the Amendment by inserting at the end of page 2 the following:

'4. Local control of local expenditure limitation.

The Legislature shall prescribe by law of general application a method by which the voters of a local unit of government may adopt an appropriation limitation for that unit, but shall not prescribe an appropriation limit for local units of government. In municipalities which have adopted municipal charters under the Constitution of Maine, Article VIII, any appropriation limitation shall be adopted in accordance with the charter amendment procedure. Once adopted by a local unit,

an appropriation limitation shall remain in effect until repealed, replaced or amended by the voters of that unit.'

Further amend the Amendment by striking out all of the 2nd paragraph on page 3 and inserting in its place the following:

'"Shall the Constitution be amended, as proposed by
the first special session of the 108th Legislature, to limit
the amount of state expenditures which may be made from undedicated
revenues without voter approval and to provide for local control
of local expenditure limitation?"'

This amendment provides for optional local limitation on local expenditures.
