STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Increase the Limit that the State Minimum Wage can Rise from \$3 to \$4.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

26 MRSA § **664**, **first** ¶, as amended by PL 1975, c. 352, is further amended to read:

By reason of the declaration of policy set forth in section 661 and in the protection of the industry or business and in the enhancement of public interest, health, safety and welfare, it is declared unlawful for any employer to employ any employee, except as otherwise provided in this subchapter, at the rate of less than \$2.30 per hour; or to require any employee to work more than 40 hours in one week, unless $1\frac{1}{2}$ times the regular hourly rate is paid for all work done over 40 hours in any one week; and whenever the highest federal minimum wage is increased in excess of \$2.30 per hour, the minimum wage established under this section shall be increased to the same amount, effective on the same date as the increase in the highest federal minimum wage, but in no case shall the minimum wage exceed \$3 \$4 per hour.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to increase the limit that the minimum wage can rise to in Maine from \$3 to \$4.
