COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 72, L.D. 81, RESOLVE,
Authorizing the Bureau of Public Lands to Convey by Sale to
the Town of Dennysville the State's Interest in Certain Real
Property in Edmunds, Washington County.

Amend the Resolve by striking out in the 2nd paragraph
in the last line (same in L.D.) the words and punctuation "or less."
and inserting in / ^{their} place the following: 'or less; and be it
further'

Further amend the Resolve by striking out all of the last
paragraph before the Statement of Fact (same in L.D.) and inserting
in its place the following:

Resolved that the director
is authorized to convey the above described property and
improvements to the property for the sum of \$1 on the condition
that it be retained by the Town of Dennysville and used exclusively
for public purposes and on the further condition that in the
event the presently unorganized township of Edmunds should, as
an individual township, hereafter become organized as a plantation
or incorporated as a town, then the Town of Dennysville shall,
promptly upon request by the Municipality of Edmunds, convey
the property to the Municipality of Edmunds for an amount of
money equal to all tax revenues spent by the Town of Dennysville
to improve the property after May 1, 1978, to the date of such
conveyance, to be retained by the Municipality of Edmunds and
used exclusively for public purposes.'

Statement of Fact

This amendment requires the Town of Dennysville to convey the property to the Municipality of Edmunds if Edmunds becomes organized as a plantation or incorporated as a town, if Edmunds so requests, and for an amount of money equal to all tax revenues spent by Dennysville to improve the property after May 1, 1978.
