## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-NINE

# AN ACT Increasing the Minimum Length of Lobsters Which may be Possessed from 3 3/16 Inches to 3 1/4 Inches.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- **Sec. 1. 12 MRSA § 6431, sub-§ 1,** as enacted by PL 1977, c. 661, § 5, is amended to read:
- 1. Minimum and maximum length. It shall be unlawful to buy, sell, give away, transport, ship or possess any lobster which is less than 3-3/16-3-1/4 inches or more than 5 inches in length, as determined by the state double gauge lobster measure.
- **Sec. 2. 12 MRSA § 6431, sub-§ 3, 2nd sentence,** as enacted by PL 1977, c. 661, § 5, is amended to read:

The measure shall have one gauge of  $\frac{3 \cdot 3/16}{10}$  3 1/4 inches and another 5 inches in length.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill will allow for some lobsters to reach breeding life and will ensure a more plentiful supply of lobsters.
