AN ACT Prohibiting Trespassing on School Property.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

20 MRSA § 3771-A is enacted to read:

§ 3771-A. Trespassing on school property

1. Trespassing. A person who is not enrolled at a school as a full-time student, or is a suspended student, shall be guilty of trespassing on school property, if, knowing that he is not privileged to do so:

A. He remains on the school property after being told by a superintendent, principal, vice principal, teacher, custodian, police officer or designee to leave; or

B. He returns to the school property within 72 hours after being told by a superintendent, principal, vice principal, teacher, custodian, police officer or designee to leave.

Trespassing on school property is a Class E crime.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill makes trespassing on school property a Class E crime.
