STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Allow Registrars of Deeds to use Rubber Stamps in Lieu of Original Signatures.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

33 MRSA § 653 is amended by adding at the end a new sentence to read:

Attestations and certifications required by this section may be made by either original signature or by use of a facsimile rubber stamp.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Presently registrars of deeds are required to place their original signature on every instrument. The use of a rubber stamp in lieu of their signature would save time and expense. This use would also make the final product more legible.
