## STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-NINE

AN ACT Appropriating Funds to Purchase 500 copies of "The History of Current Maine Newspapers" by Alan R. Miller.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

The bill appropriates funds to enable the State Library to purchase copies of "The History of Current Maine Newspapers" by Professor Alan R. Miller.

It has been the traditional policy of the Legislature to support publications dealing with Maine history. In his 627 page book, Professor Miller, a journalism professor at the University of Maine, has produced a history of such comprehensiveness and detail that it promises to be one of the major existing works on Maine newspapers. Clearly, this book deserves the solid support of the Maine Legislature.

This bill will authorize the State Library to purchase sufficient copies for its own use and for distribution to the various libraries of the State.

This book currently sells for \$14.95 in paperback and \$17.95 in hardback. The appropriation allows for a purchase of 250 hardback copies and 250 paperback copies, and also allows for a  $\frac{1}{3}$  quantity discount.
